

Did you know?

Did you know that as cheese ages, the lactose naturally breaks down? That means that many aged cheeses are safe to eat for those with lactose intolerance! Our aged gouda cheeses have little to no lactose. Most lactose is gone after about 3 months of aging in many cases. Lactose is a form of sugar, so check the sugar content on the nutrition label. Levels should be under 5 grams, preferably under 0.5 grams. Happy cheese eating!

Recipe Corner

Artichoke Chicken Spread

Ingredients:

- 12 oz. chicken breasts, skinless, boneless, cooked, cubed
- 14 oz. artichokes, drained
- $\frac{1}{2}$ cup green onions, minced
- 3 tsp. garlic, minced
- $\frac{1}{2}$ cup parmesan cheese, shredded 1 cup Monterey Jack cheese, shredded



- 1 tsp. salt
- 1 tsp. pepper
- 1 cup sour cream or low-fat sour cream
- ¹/₂ cup Robert Rothschild Raspberry Honey Mustard Pretzel Dip
- 1 tsp. chili powder
- ¹/₄ tsp. paprika
- 1 baguette, sliced

Instructions:

Preheat oven to 350°. Place chicken cubes in food processor. Pulse until coarsely ground. Add artichokes and pulse until chopped. Scoop into mixing bowl. Add green onions, garlic, Parmesan cheese, Monterey Jack cheese, salt and pepper. Mix well. In a small bowl, combine sour cream, Raspberry Honey Mustard Pretzel Dip and chili powder. Add to chicken mixture and mix well. Spray a 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ quart baking dish with cooking spray. Spoon mixture into dish. Sprinkle with paprika. Bake 25 minutes until heated through. Serve with baguette slices.
